Moment of Stillness:

As we begin our service, let's take a moment to be still and aware of God's presence within and all around us.

Christ Candle:

We light this candle to remind us that this baby, the Christ Child, who the Magi found, is with us today, here in this place.

Opening Prayer

And now, Let the weak say "I am strong!" Let the poor say "I am rich!" Because of what the Lord has done (repeat)

for us. Give thanks.

Prayer of Confession:

We come to God

knowing that we have failed to obey the call of Jesus to love God and one another with our whole hearts; but we come also to a God who reaches out to us with healing and reconciliation.

In this knowledge, let us pray

Vulnerable Jesus, we confess that we are not always trustworthy in cherishing your life among us in the world. The Herods of our time are often subtle and clever in threatening your life of justice and truth. They appeal to our inner impulses and our fears, and we fail to take our stand and prefer to keep our life safe.

Forgive us, Holy Christ. We kneel before your life in hope and faith.

Stir us up with holy discontent over a world which gives its gifts to those who have plenty already, whose talents are obvious, whose power is recognised; Help us to share our resources with those who have little and to receive with humility the gifts they bring to us. **Amen**

Bible Readings: Andrew

Jeremiah 31:7-14

For thus says the LORD: Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, "Save, O LORD, your people, the remnant of Israel." ⁸ See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labor, together: a great company, they shall return here. ⁹ With weeping they shall come, and with consolations^[a] I will lead them back, I will let them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn. ¹⁰ Hear the word of the LORD, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands far away; say, "He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd a flock." ¹¹ For the LORD has ransomed Jacob, and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him. ¹² They shall come and sing aloud on the height of Zion,

and they shall be radiant over the goodness of the LORD, over the grain, the wine, and the oil,

and over the young of the flock and the herd; their life shall become like a watered garden,

and they shall never languish again.

¹³ Then shall the young women rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old shall be merry.

I will turn their mourning into joy,

I will comfort them, and give them gladness for sorrow.

¹⁴ I will give the priests their fill of fatness,

and my people shall be satisfied with my bounty, says the LORD.

John 1:10-18

¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to what was his own,^[a] and his own people did not accept him. ¹² But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son,^[b] full of grace and truth. ¹⁵ (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") ¹⁶ From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. ¹⁷ The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son,^[c] who is close to the Father's heart,^[d] who has made him known.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper – Epiphany Liturgy: Brian

Lift your eyes and look around. The light of the babe of Bethlehem shines from the face of each one here. Let us now greet that light, rejoice that we are here together, and pass the peace of Christ, our joy and our hope.

Invitation

This is the table, not of the Church, but of Jesus. It is to be made ready for those who love him and those who want to love him more. So, come, you who are hungry for God's love. Come, you who are yearning the Christ's presence. Come, you who want community; know that you are welcome here.

Come, not because it is I who invite you: it is Jesus. It is his will that those who want him should meet him here in the place where the ordinary things like bread and wine and ourselves are made extraordinary by the Grace of God.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise. God of all blessings, we give you thanks and praise for Jesus the Light of the world, the light that no darkness can overpower;

we thank you that you have called us from darkness to walk in the light; we thank you for the insight of the magi, who by their gifts showed us that all life is a gift;

and with them, the angels and archangels and all who live in the light, we praise you, saying together:

Holy! Holy! Holy! Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Accept our praises now, loving God, as we remember Jesus, who, on the night before he died, took bread and wine,

gave you thanks and offered them to his friends, saying: this is my body, this is by blood. Eat and drink to remember me.

Come freshly to us now, present God, as we offer you our lives, renew in us your gifts; the gold of our potential, the incense of our prayers and aspirations, the myrrh of healing for our pain; feed us and nourish us, that we may grow in the life of Christ; fill us with your Spirit that we may overflow with your love, and transform the world with your glory.

Prayer of consecration

For us you were born, for us you healed, preached, taught and showed the way to your kingdom; for us you were crucified, and for us, after death, you rose again.

As we do in this place what you did in an upstairs room, send down your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine that they may become for us your body, healing, forgiving and making us whole; and that we may become, for you, your body, loving and caring in the world until your kingdom comes. Amen.

The bread that we break is a sharing in the body of Christ The cup that we take is a sharing in the blood of Christ

These are the gifts of God for the people of God.

Jesus welcomes everyone to his table, and so we offer everyone, without exception, the bread and wine, which are Christ's body and blood.

Let us receive what we are; let us become what we receive. The body of Christ.
