Welcome –

Welcome to worship at St David's on this second Sunday in Lent in 2022. Whether you are here in the Church or watching from another place, you are all very welcome.

Greeting -

Lent is traditionally the period of 40 days which comes before Easter. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Lent is a season of reflection and penitential preparation before the momentous events of Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent with prayer, fasting and bible readings, Christians undertake a modern version of Jesus Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days.

Lighting Christ's Candle

We light this light to remind us that God in Three Persons is here with us.

Moment of Stillness

As we begin our service, let's take a moment to be still and aware of God's presence within and all around us.

Acknowledgement of First Peoples

As we gather to worship God, we acknowledge the sovereign First Peoples of this country on which we gather today; the Gadigal and Wangal people. And we pay our respects to their Elders past and present, together with all descendants.

We commit ourselves to support Voice, Treaty, Truth – justice for First Nations Peoples.

Call to Worship

We have come at the invitation of our God, called into his place, called into this time, called into the presence of God. We come at the invitation of our God – the God whose call echoes across ages; resounding in space yet intimate and personal.

This is the voice that calls us to encounter:

- to encounter with grace beyond telling

John 9: 1-12

As he walked along, he saw a man blind from birth. ² His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" ³ Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him. ⁴ We^[a] must work the works of him who sent me^[b] while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. ⁵ As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." ⁶ When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva and spread the mud on the man's eyes, ⁷ saying to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). Then he went and washed and came back able to see. ⁸ The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar began to ask, "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?" ⁹ Some were saying, "It is he." Others were saying, "No, but it is someone like him." He kept saying, "I am the man." ¹⁰ But they kept asking him, "Then how were your eyes opened?" ¹¹ He answered, "The man called Jesus made mud, spread it on my eyes, and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' Then I went and washed and received my sight." ¹² They said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I do not know."
