Acknowledgement First Peoples:

We honour them for their custodianship of this land. We pray that through God's Spirit, we might be people of reconciliation.

Call to Worship:

Our God is a God of goodness. Our God is a God of love and kindness. Our God is a God of justice and truth.

With what shall we come before our God? What shall we bring into the presence of our God?

We come with humble hearts. Hearts bent toward justice. Hearts open in loving-kindness. Hearts earnestly seeking God.

Opening Prayer:

Loving God, we come this morning seeking your presence. Open our minds to your spirit of wisdom, that we may know how to live as your people. Open our hearts to your spirit of truth, that we may love all your people with a love that speaks of justice, kindness, and radical grace. In Jesus' name we pray **Amen**

Micah 6:6-8

Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"
⁸ He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?

Mark 12:28-34

²⁸ One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" ²⁹ Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; ³⁰ you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." ³² Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; ³³ and 'to love him with all the heart and with all the understanding and with all the strength' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself'—this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." ³⁴ When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." After that no one dared to ask him any question.
