Isaiah 63:7-9

I will recount the gracious deeds of the Lord,

Matthew 2:13-23

¹³ Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." ¹⁴ Then Joseph [a] got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt ¹⁵ and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, "Out of Egypt I have called my son."

¹⁶ When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the magi, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the magi. ^[C] ¹⁷ Then what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

 18 "A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation,
 Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they are no more."

¹⁹ When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, ²⁰ "Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead." ²¹ Then Joseph^[d] got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. ²² But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee. ²³ There he made his home in a town

called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, "He will be called a Nazarene."

<u>Invitation</u>

This is the table, not of the Church, but of Jesus. It is to be made ready for those who love him and those who want to love him more. So, come, you who are hungry for God's love. Come, you who are yearning the Christ's presence. Come, you who want community; know that you are welcome here.

Come, not because it is I who invite you: it is Jesus. It is his will that those who want him should meet him here in the place where the ordinary things like bread and wine and ourselves are made extraordinary by the Grace of God.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

God of all blessings, we give you thanks and praise for Jesus the Light of the world, the light that no darkness can overpower;

we thank you that you have called us from darkness to walk in the light; we thank you for the insight of the magi, who by their gifts showed us that all life is a gift;

and with them, the angels and archangels and all who live in the light, we praise you, saying together:

Holy! Holy! Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Accept our praises now, loving God, as we remember Jesus, who, on the night before he died, took bread and wine,

gave you thanks and offered them to his friends, saying: this is my body, this is by blood. Eat and drink to remember me.

Come freshly to us now, present God, as we offer you our lives, renew in us your gifts; the gold of our potential, the incense of our prayers and aspirations, the myrrh of healing for our pain; feed us and nourish us, that we may grow in the life of Christ;

fill us with your Spirit that we may overflow with your love, and transform the world with your glory.

Prayer of consecration

For us you were born, for us you healed, preached, taught and showed the way to your kingdom; for us you were crucified, and for us, after death, you rose again.

As we do in this place what you did in an upstairs room, send down your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine that they may become for us your body, healing, forgiving and making us whole; and that we may become, for you, your body, loving and caring in the world until your kingdom comes. Amen.
