Greeting:

On this Palm Sunday, as we witness Jesus entering Jerusalem, May the Lord be with you And also with you

Moment of Stillness:

There is a rumbling in us that won't let go. It stirs in us like the wind stirs leaves—inviting us to move, drawing us forth. When we're quiet, we know that rumble is the Holy Spirit, Dancing love awake in us. We're here.

And we're still.

And we're quiet.

In this quiet moment let's be still and aware of the Spirit's presence within and all around us.

Lent Candles:

In Lent we set love upon our hearts and feet and walk with Jesus towards the cross. As a reminder that Jesus did not shy from entering the darkest and most difficult places, we blow out a candle each week.

On this final Sunday in Lent, we blow out all 6 Lent candles [Blow out candles]

In our walking we know that we are not alone, for Jesus has walked this road before us, and God's Spirit rests upon us as we take this journey forward.

Acknowledgement First Peoples:

We acknowledge that we are on the land of the Gadigal and Wangal people and that the Spirit was in the land revealing God to them through law, custom and ceremony.

We honour the wisdom of the Gadigal and Wangal Elders and their continuing culture, and pray that we might all work together for reconciliation and justice in this nation.

Call to Worship:

Waving gently
Watching, whispering
The King comes riding
riding on a donkey
He is coming
He is coming

Waving wildly Singing, shouting Praise to the King Hosanna, hosanna

He is here He is here

Waving wistfully
Watching, wondering
What will happen
to the King in Jerusalem?
He is going
He is going

With them, with heart and voice, we shout:

Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord

Opening Prayer:

Holy God,

Sometimes it's hard to hear you over the hosannas.

our mental to-do lists,

or our desire to fit in.

So just as you stopped traffic in Jerusalem,

stop traffic here.

until your Word is all we can hear.

We are laying down our cloaks.

Son of David, give us the conviction to shout your name from the rooftop. Give us the wisdom to sing, "Hosanna!"
With hope in our hearts we pray to you,

Introduction to the Hebrew Bible reading:

The middle part of the book of the prophet Isaiah contains four poems that we now call the songs of the suffering servant. Here the prophet meditates on his sufferings and the price of fidelity to God.

Isaiah 50:4-9a

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word.

Morning by morning he wakens—wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward.

⁶ I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard;

I did not hide my face

from insult and spitting.

⁷The Lord God helps me;

therefore I have not been disgraced;

therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame:

8 he who vindicates me is near.

Who will contend with me?

Let us stand up together.

Who are my adversaries?

Let them confront me.

⁹ It is the Lord GoD who helps me;

who will declare me guilty?

Matthew 21:1-11

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. ³ If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." ^[a] ⁴ This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet:

⁵ "Tell the daughter of Zion,

Look, your king is coming to you,

humble and mounted on a donkey,

and on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

⁶The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; ⁷they brought the donkey and the colt and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. ⁸ A very large crowd^[b] spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting,

"Hosanna to the Son of David!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

¹⁰ When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" ¹¹ The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."

Dear friends, we are going to Jerusalem with Jesus.

He is our pardon, our healing, and our peace!

We will suffer the trial with him, resisting evil.

With him, we will walk the path to life.

But come first to the table where there is food for the journey.

With hearts full of joy we come,

giving thanks to God, our maker,

and offering our praise!

We are right to praise you, faithful God!
You answer sin with grace;
you guide our wayward steps toward home.
You are mending for the broken,
safety for the poor, belonging for the outcast,
strength for the weak, and pardon for the sinner.
You reveal your kindness in every sorrow,
your mercy even in death.
All your creatures see your works;
they sing your steadfast love.
We too declare your wonder and grace
as with angels and saints
we join in the triumphant hymn:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Now, O God, we remember Jesus. Silence...

He fasted and prayed; he was tempted and tried.

He relied on you for everything.

He was obedient to you and scorned by the powers of this world.

He confounded the haughty and gave hope to the humble.

He was betrayed and deserted. He died between thieves and was buried in a borrowed grave.

You gave him new life. He lives even now, our healer and friend.

He loved us well, loved us to the end, and loves us still.

Even on the night of betrayal, he ate supper with his friends.

And at that meal our Saviour Christ took bread and gave you thanks. He broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take, eat. This is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me'.

After supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you.
This is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for all people for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this in remembrance of me'.

With thanksgiving we take this bread and this cup and proclaim his death and resurrection. **Receive our sacrifice of praise.**

Holy Spirit, come! Make all things new. Bless this bread which you have given and human hands have made. Let it become for us the bread of life.

Bless also this cup, fruit of the vine and work of human hands.
Let it become for us the cup of salvation.
Bless us also who eat and drink, that in this sharing we may know the living Christ who is with us now, and to the end of the age.
Nourish us by these gifts to be willing servants of your world until the kingdom comes, and every creature beholds it.
We pray in Jesus' name.
