Bible Reading: Rick

Introduction to the Hebrew Bible reading:

The primary proclamation of this Psalm is that full harmony is possible because the source flows from on high. Full harmony seems so unlikely that the Psalmist has to turn to a series of similes in order to describe it. Both similes emphasise the abundance that accompanies unity. Even if we are not yet fully there, God willing, full harmony is a place toward which we are moving.

Psalm 133

¹ How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!
² It is like the precious oil on the head, running down upon the beard, on the beard of Aaron, running down over the collar of his robes.
³ It is like the dew of Hermon, which falls on the mountains of Zion.
For there the Lord ordained his blessing, life forevermore.

Mark 4:35-41

35 On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." 36 And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. 37 A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. 38 But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" 39 He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. 40 He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" 41 And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"
