Bible Reading: Alison

Introduction to the Hebrew Bible reading:

The book of Proverbs is the most well know book of "Wisdom" in the Hebrew Bible and is associated with Solomon. Wisdom literature seeks to teach its hearers how to live well. This wisdom is handed down from parents to children and is based not on revelation but on experience and observation. In the words of Ellen Davis, "The proverbs are spiritual guides for ordinary people, on an ordinary day, when water does not pour forth from rocks and angels do not come to lunch."

Proverbs 22:1-2, 8-9, 22-23 (The Message)

A sterling reputation is better than striking it rich; a gracious spirit is better than money in the bank.
² The rich and the poor shake hands as equals— God made them both!
⁸ Whoever sows sin reaps weeds, and bullying anger sputters into nothing.
⁹ Generous hands are blessed hands because they give bread to the poor.
²²⁻²³ Don't walk on the poor just because they're poor, and don't use your position to crush the weak,
Because God will come to their defence; the life you took, he'll take from you and give back to them.

Mark 7:24-37 (NRSV)

²⁴ From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre.^[a] He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, ²⁵ but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. ²⁶ Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷ He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." ²⁸ But she answered him, "Sir,^[b] even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." ²⁹ Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter." ³⁰ So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

³¹ Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. ³² They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. ³³ He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. ³⁴ Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." ³⁵ And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. ³⁶ Then Jesus^[C] ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷ They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak".
