**Bible Reading: Alison Burnett**

**Introduction to the Hebrew Bible reading:**

In Psalm 104, the world that God creates and recreates is not just ordered, but rhythmic, each created thing a note that contributes to the Spirit's song. The whole of creation is like a song of joy sung by the Spirit of the Lord. There is joy in the wondrous interdependence of God's creatures and in the necessity in which we exist for one another.

**Psalm 104:1-13 (NRSV)**

Bless the Lord, O my soul.

O Lord my God, you are very great.

You are clothed with honour and majesty,

<sup>2</sup> wrapped in light as with a garment.

You stretch out the heavens like a tent;

<sup>3</sup> you set the beams of your<sup>[a]</sup> chambers on the waters;

you make the clouds your<sup>[b]</sup> chariot;

you ride on the wings of the wind;

<sup>4</sup> you make the winds your<sup>[c]</sup> messengers,

fire and flame your<sup>[d]</sup> ministers.

<sup>5</sup> You set the earth on its foundations,

so that it shall never be shaken.

<sup>6</sup> You cover it with the deep as with a garment;

the waters stood above the mountains.

<sup>7</sup> At your rebuke they flee;

at the sound of your thunder they take to flight.

<sup>8</sup> They rose up to the mountains, ran down to the valleys,  
to the place that you appointed for them.

<sup>9</sup> You set a boundary that they may not pass,  
so that they might not again cover the earth.

<sup>10</sup> You make springs gush forth in the valleys;  
they flow between the hills,

<sup>11</sup> giving drink to every wild animal;  
the wild asses quench their thirst.

<sup>12</sup> By the streams<sup>[e]</sup> the birds of the air have their habitation;  
they sing among the branches.

<sup>13</sup> From your lofty abode you water the mountains;  
the earth is satisfied with the fruit of your work.

### **Mark 9:38-50**

<sup>38</sup> John said to him, “Teacher, we saw someone<sup>[a]</sup> casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him, because he was not following us.” <sup>39</sup> But Jesus said, “Do not stop him; for no one who does a deed of power in my name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of me. <sup>40</sup> Whoever is not against us is for us. <sup>41</sup> For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward.

<sup>42</sup> “If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me,<sup>[b]</sup> it would be better for you if a great millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea. <sup>43</sup> If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life maimed than to have two hands and to go to hell,<sup>[c]</sup> to the unquenchable fire.<sup>[d]</sup> <sup>45</sup> And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame than to have two feet and to be thrown into hell.<sup>[e][f]</sup> <sup>47</sup> And if your eye causes you to stumble, tear it out; it is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and to be thrown into hell,<sup>[g]</sup> <sup>48</sup> where their worm never dies, and the fire is never quenched.

<sup>49</sup> “For everyone will be salted with fire.<sup>[h]</sup> <sup>50</sup> Salt is good; but if salt has lost its saltiness, how can you season it?<sup>[i]</sup> Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another.”
