Call to Worship:

Bible Readings: Chris L

Introduction to New Testament reading:

Today's New Testament reading follows on from last week's reading. Jesus has begun his ministry preaching in the synagogues of his hometown. He has quoted from the book of Isaiah and although the reaction of the crowd was at first favourable, this seems to quickly change. Now they want to kill him. Is it his presumption, his promotion of the sharing of wealth, or that he refuses to give any credentials? Perhaps all of the above. In all their rage, Jesus remains unharmed.

Luke 4:21-30

²¹ Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." ²² All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is this not Joseph's son?" ²³ He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard

you did at Capernaum.' "²⁴ And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in his hometown. ²⁵ But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months and there was a severe famine over all the land, ²⁶ yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon. ²⁷ There were also many with a skin disease in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." ²⁸ When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. ²⁹ They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. ³⁰ But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

Jeremiah 1:4-10

⁴ Now the word of the Lord came to me saying, ⁵ "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born, I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations." ⁶ Then I said, "Ah, Lord God! Truly I do not know how to speak, for I am only a boy." ⁷ But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a boy,' for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and you shall speak whatever I command you. ⁸ Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, says the Lord." ⁹ Then the Lord put out his hand and touched my mouth, and the Lord said to me, "Now I have put my words in your mouth. ¹⁰ See, today I appoint you over nations and over kingdoms, to pluck up and to pull down, to destroy and to overthrow, to build and to plant."

Come to the banquet there's a place for you.

Communion:

This is the table, not of the Church, but of Jesus. It is to be made ready for those who love him and those who want to love him more. So, come, you who are hungry for God's love. Come, you who are yearning the Christ's presence. Come, you who want community; know that you are welcome here.

Why have we gathered here? We come because we have been called to live out a story.

What story shall we live? The story of saving love.

Where did this story begin? It was whispered before time began. It was sung in the melody of Creation.

Whose story is this?

This story is God's alone to tell. It hums in the rivers and the trees. It whispers in the skies and the seas. It calls to the people of all places. It speaks in our hearts, in our lives.

Why then should we speak of this story?

This story calls our name in Creation. This story claims our lives through the Cross. This story shaped our future through the Spirit. We are its telling in this time and this place.

So, tell me the story of this night and of this table.

The Lord Jesus, on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it (bread is broken).

Tell me what he said and did. **'This is my body which is broken for you. Do this to make me real to you.**

Tell me what he said and did next (lift cup) In the same way, he took the cup and said 'This is a new covenant in my love. Drink it to make me real to you.

This is our common story, our deep memory, our true destiny.

So, let it also be our story-telling, our testimony. Let's celebrate the way that grace has shaped our lives. I invite you to say aloud what you are thankful for...

(we share what we are thankful for)

Hear the storytelling of all ages singing with us: (sung response TIS 761)

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

What is our prayer on this day? (everyone holds their hands in blessing)

Pour out your Holy spirit on us, so that this everyday meal becomes an eternal feast. So that our eating and drinking today unites us with Christ making us one body. So we know that you live in us and that we live in you. So that we live in your world knowing it is indeed yours. Living God, this is our prayer Amen

Distribution

Let us receive this holy sacrament of the body and blood of Christ, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

(we eat and drink together)

<u>Concluding prayer</u> In gratitude, in deep gratitude for this moment, this meal, these people, we give ourselves to you. Take us out to live as changed people because we have shared the Living Bread and cannot remain the same. **May we live to your glory, bringing your love and peace to your world.**
